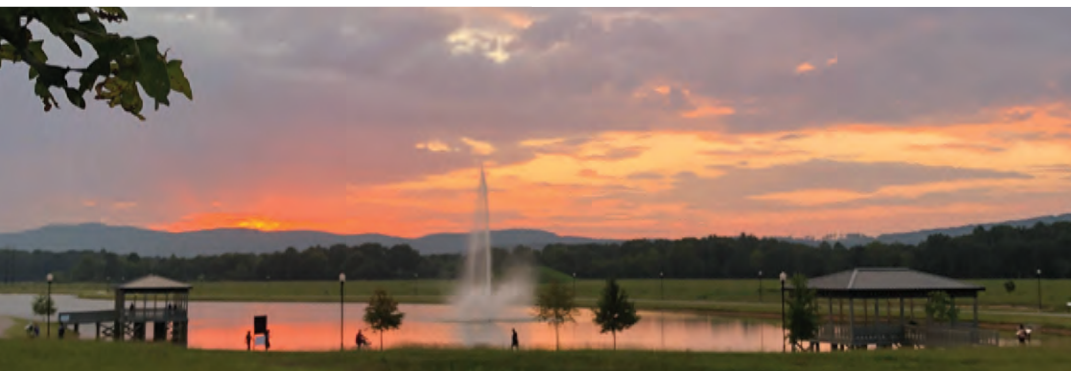

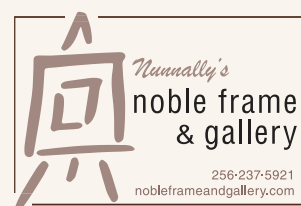

Things We Love about Calhoun County

Calhoun County: In The Heart of Perfect

Situated along I-20, nestled in the foothills of the Appalachian Mountains, Calhoun County is at the heart of some of the biggest metro areas in the South. If one were to throw a dart to choose a destination for natural attractions and historical significance, Calhoun County would be a bull's eye every time. Located approximately 45 minutes from Birmingham and 90 minutes from Atlanta, the county-which includes the cities of Anniston, Oxford, Jacksonville, Hobson City, Piedmont, Ohatchee, and Weaver-has a hybrid of relaxation and excitement to make it the place of your dreams.

With access to the Amtrak train, major highways, a Greyhound station, and bike trails, it's a short and easy trip from everywhere.

Natural Attraction

Many of our attractions center on nature: from horseback riding trails at Camp McClellan, fishing at Lake Yahou or Neely Henry Lake, kayaking on Choccolocco or Terrapin Creek, camping at Cheaha State Park, hiking the Pinhoti Trail, or riding Ladiga, McClellan and Coldwater Mountain Bike Trails. With each morning's sunrise over the mountains, whether in car, on foot or pedaling away, the natural beauty of Calhoun County shines through.

Main Street

Many of our municipalities boast picturesque historic downtown areas, complete with unique restaurants, one of a kind boutiques, and local shops. Several municipalities host seasonal weekly farmers markets and offer great greenspace for hosting community events and performances.

Unforgettable Performances

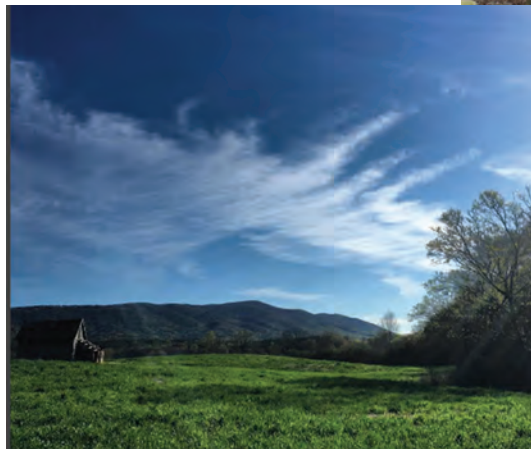
Our blooming art communities offer their share of festivals and state of the art performance venues, like Jacksonville State University, Oxford Performing Arts Center, and Knox, featuring world renowned performances on local stages, bringing Broadway to our communities, symphonic sounds, and crowds to their feet.

From Civil War to Civil Rights

Calhoun County is abundant in history. From Choccolocco various artifacts have been unearthed dating from the Creek and Indian War, some of which are displayed at the Janney Furnace Civil War & Native American Museum. The Freedom Riders National Monument and the Church of St. Michaels and All Angels are just a few locations of historical significance and architecture in our area.

Tee Time

While we may have good sweet tea, we also have some sweet golf courses. These include the Robert Trent Jones Golf Trail at Silver Lakes, the award winning Cider Ridge Golf Club, Cane Creek, "The Hill" Anniston Municipal Golf Course, and Pine Hill Country Club, there's a different course for each golfer's preference.



Fun Facts

With land ceded in 1832, Calhoun County was originally named Benton County, but the history goes far beyond that with excursions of DeSoto dating to 1540 and incidents of the Creek Indian War in 1813.

Communities

The Model City – Anniston

Anniston's history began after the Civil War, when the Tyler and Noble families designed a key industrial element in the New South in 1872. The town grew surrounding the Woodstock Iron Company and cotton mill. Originally a private company town, Anniston opened to a broader public in 1883, attracting more commercial and industrial activity. In 1899, the county seat of Calhoun County moved from Jacksonville to Anniston. More than 100 years later, the community is a center of industry and commerce with more than 20,000 residents (as of 2020). Now, Anniston is home to numerous restaurants, shops, a Downtown summer Farmers' Market, and more. For more information, visit www.anniston.al.gov.

Anniston Civil Rights Trail & Freedom Riders National Monument

In Downtown Anniston, visitors can take a walking tour of the Civil Rights Trail through Anniston. Located at 1031 Gurnee Ave. and on the corner of 9th and Noble, two murals and panels recap the events of 1961, depicting the history of Calhoun County during the Civil Rights movement.

Explore the wilds of Africa, the mysteries of 2,300 year old Egyptian Mummies and more than 2,000 natural history items in the Anniston Museum of Natural History. See Colonel Berman's incredible and fascinating collection of weapons, like a flute that shoots, and hundreds of objects like bronzes by Remington and Russell, Asian Art, Winchesters, and a Greek helmet, more than 2,000 years old at the Berman Museum of World History. Take a walk around the grounds at Longleaf Botanical Gardens.

The Complex has 5 softball & baseball fields, perfect for all ages and groups, practices, games & tournaments.

Camp McClellan Horse Trails

Located on Mud Hole Rd. off of Iron Mountain Rd.
256-589-9443
Camp McClellan is a 900-acre equestrian campground on the historic former Ft. McClellan Military Base with over 28 miles of well-marked trails, formed by a partnership with the Calhoun County Commission and the McClellan Chapter of Back Country Horsemen of America (BCHA).

Cane Creek Golf Course

66 Galloway Gate Road, Anniston, (256) 820-9174. This 18 Hole par 72 golf course is located off Baltzell Gate Road on the former Ft. McClellan in Anniston.

Centennial Memorial Park

225 E 17th St., Anniston. Since 1999, this site serves as the official home of Alabama's Veterans Memorial and State Law Enforcement Memorial. The names of every Alabamian killed during World War I, World War II, the Korean War, Vietnam, Persian Gulf, and officers killed in the line of duty are engraved on the granite wall. Resolutions have been passed adding Afghanistan and Iraq as well as Firefighters.

Church of St. Michael and All Angels

1000 W. 18th St, Anniston, (256) 237-4011
The Church of St. Michael and All Angels is a national historic landmark and also maintains an active congregation. Founded by John Ward Noble, the church was consecrated on St. Michael's Day in September, 1890. The Norman architecture, hand-crafted internal and external features, Italian marble altar, massive pipe organ, and beautiful stained-glass windows draw tourists both locally and nationally every year.

Coldwater Mountain Bike Trail

Off Hwy 202, Anniston
Located on 4,000 acres of Coldwater Mountain in Anniston, this world class trail offers both 1.5 mile beginner loops, for riders of any level, and a 10 mile

Blue Loop for intermediate riders. Currently, more than 35 miles of singletrack trails have been built under the supervision of IMBA Trail Solutions. Two locations are available for access to the trails. The Coldwater Trailhead is located at 1661 Coldwater Road in Anniston, while the Anniston Trailhead is located at 401 Monsanto Street in Anniston. For more information, visit www.neaba.net.

Mountain Longleaf National Wildlife Refuge

Bains Gap Road, Anniston, With more than 6,000 acres, this area was designated as a National Wildlife Refuge to protect a unique and endangered ecosystem, the mountain longleaf pine forest. This land is also home to the Bains Gap Waterfall and trails.

Pine Hill Country Club

175 Pine Hill Drive, Anniston, (256) 237-2633
This 18 hole par 72 course and driving range is located off Choccolocco Road in Anniston.

White Oak Vineyards

1484 Dry Hollow Road, Anniston, (256) 231-7998. White Oak Vineyards is a small farm winery that grows the fruit used to produce wines for their trademark label, Southern Oak Wines. Their tasting room is open on Thursdays, Fridays and Saturdays.

Anniston Municipal "The Hill" Golf Course

This 9 Hole par 35 golf course features well groomed fairways and greens. Designed by L.T.Smith, the Hill golf course opened in 1922.

Lake Yahou Park

The 8-acre freshwater lake and surrounding forested land, which have not been used recreationally since 1999, will now feature a peaceful half-mile walking trail, scenic 17-mile multi-use trail, rustic picnic area and bench seating by the lake. Stocked with hundreds of largemouth bass, copperhead bluegills, and fathead minnows, Lake Yahou offers catch-and-release fishing with a \$5.00 McClellan Development Authority (MDA) fishing license."

McClellan Multi-Use Trails

460 BG DH Stem Road, Anniston
Located on the former Ft. McClellan army installation, trail names capture the history of the military base, community figures and local heroes. McClellan's Multi-Use Trails include the first Phase I trails in Alabama built specifically for the middle and high school bike races. There are a total of three phases of difficulty across 18 miles of forested trails, making them the perfect setting for biking, hiking, walking, and running. Local and state-wide athletic groups also host various biking and running events at McClellan's Multi-Use Trails throughout the year.

About the time the Creek Indians were departing from this area in 1832-1833, Sylvanus Simmons and Dudley Snow homesteaded lands in the newly created Benton County. The state legislature first incorporated the town with the name Oxford in 1852. By 1860 Oxford was linked to the outer world via the Alabama and Tennessee Rivers Railroad. Oxford became active as a cotton and trading center on the eve of the Civil War. Despite the setbacks of the war, Oxford rebuilt, grew and prospered.

Oxford is known as one of Calhoun County's fastest growing residential and commercial cities. It stretches across the county line into neighboring Talladega County. The investment in Oxford's facilities and amenities is part of an ongoing effort to be recognized as "The Crossroads and Retail Capital of Calhoun County," as well as a safe and comfortable place to raise a family. Several historic sites are located in the vicinity of Ohatchee including the site of the former Fort Strother at which Gen. Andrew Jackson was headquartered during part of the Creek Indian Wars in the early 1800's and Janney Furnace, which was a pig iron furnace constructed during the Civil War. Ohatchee's business environment includes fishing and recreational businesses, industrial companies, forestry related businesses, and a small retail and service district.

The Town of Hobson City

Yes, there are fewer than 1,000 people in this small historic town, but its name is larger than life. Hobson City, located adjacent to Oxford, was incorporated in 1899. The citizens created a city of their own. Originally known as the Mooree Quarters section of Oxford, the town was named after Richmond P. Hobson, a white naval hero and member of Congress, and in July 1899, Hobson City became the second municipality in the South controlled and governed entirely by African Americans. Hobson City is a town of history and heritage, celebrating their Founders Day annually each August.

J.R. Striplin Park

610 Martin Luther King Drive

As Alabama's oldest incorporated African American Town, founded in 1899, Hobson City is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. J.R. Striplin Park has basketball courts, a playground, and great picnicking areas available for family gatherings. Here, there is also the historic marker, capturing the historic story of this town.

Hobson City Museum for the Study of African-American History and Culture

715 Martin Luther King Drive, Hobson City

Alabama's first incorporated Black municipality in Alabama and the second in the nation, established in 1899, this museum features archives and artifacts from the era.

Small Town Life- Weaver, Alabama

The City of Weaver is a growing community, with The Chief Ladiga Trail running through the city along Elwell Park and connecting the county, north, to Jacksonville and Piedmont.

Check out the annual Christmas Parade in December, and the annual Weaver Station Heritage Day Celebration held in the Fall. You will fall in love with this little town that's a big city at heart. For more information, visit www.weaver-alabama.org.

Chief Ladiga Trail

Anniston/Weaver/Jacksonville/Piedmont

The Chief Ladiga Trail currently runs 32.5 miles from the Alabama/Georgia line into the City of Anniston. As Alabama's first Rails to Trails project, this paved recreational trail follows the former Seaboard/CSX Railroad and connects to Georgia's 63 mile Silver Comet Trail, making Ladiga part of the longest paved rail trail in the U.S. for walkers, bikers, skaters, strollers and more.

Weaver City Park (Elwell Park)

Cheaha State Park also has cabins, chalets, and a hotel to accommodate anyone wanting to explore the highest peak.

A 12-foot- high elevated platform provides bow hunters with an opportunity to simulate hunting conditions at targets from 10-40 yards. There is also a 10 target walk through course for archers to shoot at targets at unknown distances.

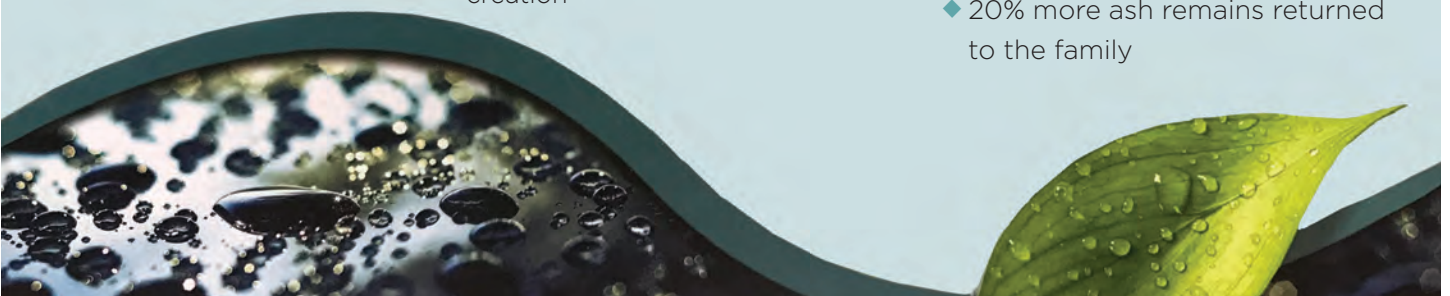

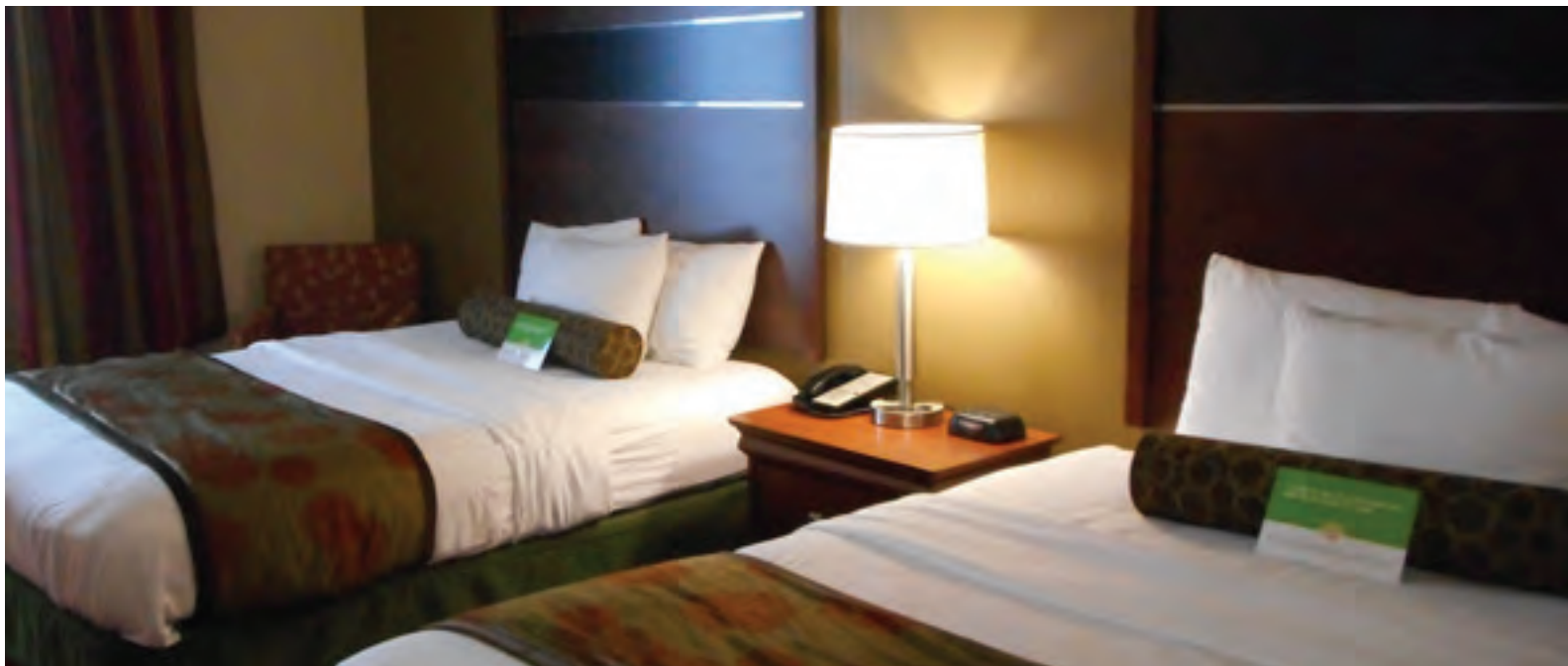
